

▲ichael Jackson just died!" Those were the words that I saw as I was reading a friend's Facebook status. Here we go with the silly rumors again I thought to myself. You're probably asking yourself why I was so excited to write about him if this is how I feel. I'll tell you why. Because regardless of everything he is Michael Jackson and though I could not relate to him anymore, our fathers were painfully similar men and our mothers are somewhat similar to each other as well. Therefore my personal belief is that much of his persona and what possessed him throughout his entire life stemmed from nothing but pain. And I get that, trust me I get pain but this isn't about me. Through that pain, Michael Jackson still managed to give us the gift of his music, dance and his charitable heart. For over forty years, Michael Jackson lived his life in the very public eye being idolized, ridiculed, worshipped, judged and the list goes on. The more I talk about it, the more I realize that I am guilty of some of these actions myself but at the same time I proudly admit that I am forever in his debt. You see an insanely large part of my life is consumed by memories. These memories range from the good to not so good and everything in between and music has almost always gone hand in hand with my all too frequent trips down memory lane.

Enter little Michael Jackson and his big brothers. To this day the Jackson 5 Christmas Album is my favorite holiday album and it makes me feel safe and warm and young again and full of love and hope. Today I can listen to Michael belt out "I Saw Mommy Kissing Santa Claus" and close my eyes and time stands still. I swear to you I am right back in Brooklyn under the Christmas tree shaking gifts and every smell, every sound, every ounce of feeling I felt back then, is back and it's in the here and now. It's mine again but for a moment at least, and my heart can almost explode sometimes. That's how strong a hold those Motown days still have on me. Crazy, huh? "Mama's Pearl", "ABC", "The Love You Save My Be Your Own", come on the list goes on and on and I sit here now smiling and wiping tears away because I realize that nothing else matters. Not the surgeries or the strange marriages, not the self indulgent ranch or the accusations, or even his skin color. None of this fazes me for a second anymore. Why in my adult life did I turn up my nose at the mention of his name for so many years? Why is it now that doctors are coming out saying that Michael had a skin disease called Vitiligo that caused his skin to be lighter? He'd given me everything I needed and wanted in the earlier parts of his incredible career. Michael Jackson and his brothers lived in our living room on that old record player in the seventies as I played and I danced and I fantasized about what my life would be like someday. Right there, he was there with me as I grew –and I loved him so! He was there by my side when I morphed into a rebellious teen and left home in the eighties. In the early nineties he was still around but I was just way too busy becoming a woman and shortly thereafter we went our separate ways. I'd check in from time to time but for me the fire had gone out so to speak.

I cannot tell a lie and pretend for the sake of this piece that I was running around in zippered jackets cheering Michael Jackson on throughout his career. His early music that he performed with his brothers and the solo Off The Wall, Thriller and Bad days is the music I've played religiously throughout my life. Again, a lot of his music has forced me to shake my butt over the last couple of decades but I froze him in time way, way back in the day. That's my Michael Jackson and that's how I have always chosen to see and know him in my mind. So no more blanks, I've filled in all the empty spaces with what makes me feel good and connected to such an enormous phenomenon and that thing that makes me feel good. There are probably hundreds of thousands of people named Michael Jackson but there can only be one MICHAEL JACKSON!!

Thank you Michael – I will always, always remember the time.....



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
ROOMED FOR REATNESS Dr. Kris F. Erskine, Sr. Pastor Bethany Baptist Church Harlem, NY

Aiden Wilson Tozer was an American Protestant pastor, preacher, author, magazine editor, Bible conference speaker, and spiritual mentor who made life changing comments that are still awing the minds of millions today. Here is some great advice for every wife to be. Get to know him and what he really wants and needs, not just what YOU want to give him. If it sounds like real men are sensitive it's because they are!


There are a few things that every husband or future husband should know that his wife wants, and there are a few things that every wife or wife to be should know her husband wants.

KIMBURRELL: NO WAYS TIRED

No Ways Tired, Kim Burrell's 3rd studio album, is about 90% cover songs that you probably heard growing up in church and maybe even sang along with them as you read the green hymn book. Whatever the case, Kim Burrell translated these songs into current day and made them all her own; which solidifies her as one of the greatest singers of our time.

The album starts off with Kim pretty much warming up over a 2009 jazzy version of Stevie Wonder's Sir Duke. Even when she is scatting candidly she sounds magnificent! "Happy" is one of two original songs on the set and once you hear the first few words, "I'm so happy and I know it Hallelu", you immediately recognize that Kim Burrell is BACK! Cheryl "Coko" Clemons releases her 2nd Gospel album on Light Records this summer called THE WINNER IN ME. While there are still some who say, Coko – from the group SWV, I think the time has come where we can officially say she has created her own lane. Coko has most certainly earned herself a distinction from her past life as part of one of music's most successful female R&B groups. She's set herself apart vocally with a signature soprano voice that is unrivaled; but also as an artist who has successfully made the leap from R&B to Gospel.

Coko's musical progression is more about her maturity in her relationship with God than about switching genres. While she's probably always been in the Church and always had a relationship with God – it is now evident that the relationship is much deeper and more personal. THE WINNER IN ME is an album that reveals a depth and an intimacy about Coko that has never really been heard before. Coko threw open the doors of the studios on this one and includes a bevy of guest artists and a variety of producers that keeps this CD fresh. Among the shining stars – Israel Houghton on "Joy Of The Lord," fellow R&B-turn-Gospel diva Kelly Price on the impassioned and stylized "Oh Mary," and the hard-hitting, rocking "Make A Way," with breakthrough Gospel star

However, Moss does not disappoint on this song AT ALL as he sings the song like a jazz pro with passion and anointing all rolled into one. As the album draws to a close, you begin to understand that J. Moss really gave us some of the best songs he has to offer and once the last song (which is the title track) plays, it is solidified. The title track "Just James" at first listen sounds identical to Jennifer Hudson's "If this isn't love" and could easily fit in with all of the "Top 40" songs of today. ▲t is very rare that an artist can release two solo albums and become a legend not only in their genre of music but in all genres. It is even more of a rarity that an artist who does not release a new body of work in over eight years is still considered relevant. There's your regular artist and then there's Kim Burrell! Kim Burrell's debut release was the buzz of 1996 simply because we had never heard gospel music sound quite like this; refreshing and jazzy. Once her second effort, Everlasting Life, was released it became an instant classic. Kim Burrell is a singer's singer. Singers love her because she does things with her voice that some would otherwise be afraid to do. Musicians love her because she understands musicianship and always has at least one instrumental piece on each of her albums. So why did it take eight years for new material? To be quite honest she has been very visible, working consistently during her hiatus and lending her voice on projects from the likes of Stevie Wonder, Missy Elliott, R. Kelly, Donald Lawrence, Harry Connick, Jr., Richard Smallwood and many others.

It's less than 48 hours after the mysterious death of the legendary Michael Jackson and Kim Burrell is meek, yet jovial. She talks about why after eight years of not releasing any new material, she decided to do an entire album of cover songs. She also talks about her encounter with King of Pop and the person that has her smiling these days. This is Kim Burrell like you've never seen her, uncanny, transparent, funny, sad and just plain ole Kim! It's like she never left...

Root-Everyone is asking "what took you so long to grace us with another album?" It has been 8 years since you released a full album of new material.

Kim Burrell-This answer is difficult. I was working the whole time and I just decided to do a recording and self write. I got together with the producer of the company that I am now affiliated with. I'm not signed to any label I just did a business deal with Shanachie Records and we put some songs out. Actually I'm going to work on two more albums before the year is out

Root-Wow!!!

Kim Burrell-That will make up for lost time.

Root-It sure will. So after so much time in between albums, what made you do an album full of cover tunes as opposed to all new material?

Kim Burrell-Because I have two more albums to do and I just wanted to have fun with it. I also wanted to present songs that people are used to hearing a certain way. A lot of people say, "Oh I like Kim Burrell but I don't understand her singing." So I wanted to do some songs they may know, so they can say, "Oh that's her stuff!" You know kind of make them familiar with me a little bit better. And I like those songs, I just happened to choose them and it's more relaxing. Some people listen to gospel and sometimes gospel is full of energy! BeBe and CeCe... they are kind of laid back. I kind of wanted to do something laid back, you know?

Root-I understand totally. The great thing about your album is that you made it your own and nothing sounds like anything that you heard on the previous versions. You definitely made it your own.

Kim Burrell-Thank you.

Root-I love it. Like the reprise for "Jesus", I absolutely love it!!

Kim Burrell-Are you serious?

Root-I love the original, but myself and a friend of mine were in the car listening to the reprise like "do you hear this?" It's just so candid.

Kim Burrell-Wow, I'm glad to hear you feel that way.

Root-Yeah definitely. You've been admired and praised by everyone from Beyonce to Harry Connick Jr. to Stevie Wonder. Harry Connick Jr. even referred to you as one of the greatest musical minds of our time. How does that make you feel?

Kim Burrell-It makes me feel like my yes to God was full and complete. For him to really hear that, not that I doubt my years to God, but for somebody who, I know a little bit about Harry but not much to say what his walk with God is, to make him discern that or to make that kind of statement is very humbling and it makes me feel so great. It makes me know that God really did give me something special that exemplifies his nature, that would make people who don't sing gospel hear his voice. It's gratifying, spiritual gratifying.

Root-Exactly. You went from an Independent Record label to status with a major record labels like Electra and Sony. I recently heard Yolanda Adams say that she would never record for a major record label. What's your take on that as far as Majors vs. Independents?

Kim Burrell-I never say never, because only God and I know where she is coming from and I agree, she's my home girl. I agree with her based on what she's saying, but I would never say never because I'm watching God turn some things around in this world at a pace that certain people want to ignore. I guess if someone reads this one would say, "what is it that you see that I don't see" "What is it that Mr. Obama, the government or the industry is doing that is turning things around to make you say never?" Everybody didn't go bankrupt. You have a company right now that's gospel, that's on top of everybody right now and they are doing their thing. And if God be for you, who can be against you? Therefore, I never say never and I agree with Yolanda to a certain extent because there is so many things in the gospel recording business that will make you say, "Nah, I'll pass." But I'm here for the long haul and whatever will be, will be.

Root-And you don't feel slighted by any record labels because it just seemed like a big shuffle?

Kim Burrell-No, I don't feel slighted at all because God protected me in such a way and he orchestrated my deals with these record companies. From Independent to Sony to Elektra to the whole transition of the Warner Bros. engine.

Root-You were still very much visible even with you not having an album out.

Kim Burrell-Yes, I escaped with no scars because God did it. It's hard to explain. People would look at my paperwork and say, "Come on, you're lying there is no way you got out of this without going to court." Sorry, Jesus already went to the cross, that was my court and I'm done!

Root-That's powerful. How do you balance ministry with motherhood?

Kim Burrell-It's hard. The hard part about it is not being able to have him with me everywhere. He's with me in my heart. People that are close to me, especially when I'm on the road, I know I get on their nerves because I speak of Christian all the time. Christian is very special to me.

Root-How old is he?

Kim Burrell-Christian will be seven years old in September.

Root-Wow! Time is flying!

Kim Burrell-Yeah and in my heart he is still seven months. Sometimes I have to let him have his independence but the funny thing is I have no choice because he has this independence that supersedes his father and I. I have never seen anyone like him, he's not aggressive, he's just very confident and he doesn't allow me to do some of the things that I would like to do with him anymore. After accepting that, I realized that for the call of God on my son's life I have to take my hands off. I didn't see my son through the eyes of God and I know that he has a life to live, especially through the life of a woman who loves God and serves God as well as a father who serves God. He has no choice but to do what the will of the Lord is. I have to start out treating him that way. So it's kind of hard, it's my little baby. But it's easy because he is so musically inclined. He likes stuff that I don't get. His favorite drummer for the month is Tony Royster Jr. who is world renowned. Tony has played with Jay-Z and he has so many DVDs out. Tony came to my house about two years ago and Christian never forgot that.

Kim Burrell-He brought Christian some sticks and Christian just sits and listens to Tony. If I don't stop him, he will sit for three and four hours on YouTube and he will say, "Mommy, I need you to come here and listen to this" and while I'm listening, my son is moving his hands exactly the way Tony is doing, feet included. At the tender age of seven, he is very, very talented.

Root-What's crazy about that is my daughter is six and she is into drums and as a father I'm like you don't want to do something else?

Kim Burrell- Don't fight it because she is learning rhythm, she will eventually be a singer. And to have a mind as a drummer, nobody is going to be able to beat that.

Root-I never looked at it that way. You know the world is mourning the death of Michael Jackson. Did you ever get the chance to work with him or meet him?

Kim Burrell-I met him in the Bahamas in 1998. We were there for the opening of the Atlantis Hotel and it was every personality in Hollywood and in music. Everyone from Madonna, P. Diddy, Steven Spielberg, Quincy Jonés, Stevie Wonder, Oprah Winfrey, Gail King, Stedman, Denzel, Sting. Anybody that you could ever think of in movies and/or music was there, including Michael. I will never forget; Myself, Donnie McClurkin, BeBe Winans and James Ingram was coming off the top of the mountain and we had just finished singing and the police were bringing Michael on the golf cart and people from the same industry that he is in were breaking their backs to take pictures of this guy because he was just that infectious. He was a genius and I feel special towards him because we were born in the same month. My birthday is August 26 and he is August 29. I'd always held that special because I know that Virgos are very strange individuals and I'm not into horoscopes like that but I read them from time to time. But with Michael, I always felt like we did know each other because we have so many similar traits. I understood him sitting up in a tree because he was an extremist. What else do you do in your forties when you've done everything in your teens and twenties that most people only dream of? What else would you do? He could have done anything. But he was being himself and I'll miss him for being creative and I'll miss knowing what he could have been at 60. I'll miss what his interview could have been at 70.

Root-It doesn't matter, saved or saved, Christian or Buddhist, Michael Jackson touched everybody.

Kim Burrell-He touched everybody! I was actually going to London on July 13 to see him perform.

Root-Were you?

Kim Burrell-Yes. I talked to Rodney Jerkins and I was going to go with him on a private jet and fly out to London and meet him before the concert, up close and personal. In retrospect, I'm glad I didn't because if I met him up close like that it would have been very hard for me. Like right now there is a deep cry inside of me for Michael. I told my mom today, on the way to the airport they were playing him singing "Gone to soon" and they were playing different peoples interviews since he's died. And then he will come in again with "Gone too soon." It was so much for me that I had to turn the radio off. I just know that in two weeks when this hits me that I'm going to cry.

Root-I know. It's so hard to believe that the King of Pop is gone.

Kim Burrell-Yea I'm going to cry and I'm going to take my time and cry because he deserves it. I'm going to meet him one day.

Root-Ok we are going to do a little word association before I end and just tell your thoughts on these individuals. Stevie Wonder?

Kim Burrell-My friend, genius.

Root-Nancy Wilson?

Kim Burrell-A Lady. Smart.

Root-Yolanda Adams?

Kim Burrell-Funny, creative.


Root-Kim Burrell?





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

Root: Sierra, you have a spoken word piece entitled Talking to God. Where did the inspiration from that particular poem come from? that and say who am I talking to and are they listening or responding. The poem for me was just kind of playing with the idea of like who this person is for me and how important he is to me and how I want to communicate. I know that it is a common theme, that struggle of is anyone listening when I am talking to someone out there and it's just sort of about that idea.

Root: You're one of the big names in the spoken word scene. Who are some of your influences?

Sierra: Some of my biggest influences are Andrea Gibson; she's a spoken word artist out of Denver. She's a phenomenal writer, great flow. Enish Moskani is another poet out of Seattle who is really great. Most of my influences are a lot of local people that I see like Omni, who I will be performing with later.



What are your

views on "The Church"?

Sierra: I grew up in a Christian family and I have an excellent assortment of friends. One side of the spectrum is agnostic or atheist and the other side who are very strong Catholics and I like to say that religion and the church holds a very important place in my life and I think that it is important to find a happy medium because I see both extremes of the situation and I the most important thing for me is respect and tolerance for all. Church has always been something that is rooted in my family and has been important to me.

Root: Have any of your works been published?

Sierra: I just got a book deal to get my manuscript published by Red Bloody publishing, coming out in September.

Root: What's next for Sierra?

Sierra: The book deal changed my whole life. However, next I will be editing the book with this publishing company and it will be released in September. From there I will be doing a spoken word tour for about two months so I will be living on the road.

type of poetry is taboo in this scene as your type of poetry is cleaner and Christian based. How did you feel when you actually won?

Thee Apprentice: To win the 2009 Nyorican Slam team was a very big accom-plishment, especially because of my type of poetry. For the most part, my poems are positive, Christ centered, faith centered and all about positivity. So to make it in an atmosphere where Christ isn't really welcomed or digested felt really good. I won on a Friday and I was stuck for four days because I was in a state of shock. I was speaking to my brother about it and I shared with him that you get so used to putting your best foot forward and not making it across that you tend to find confidence in the fact that you know you gave it your all. But to have given it my all and to cross over was just HUGE. Also, all the people that came out that night and supported, made a difference because in slams sometimes the crowd tends to sway the judges so because there was such a large crowd that supported me, it put pressure on some of the other poets. Some of them actually tried to do poems with God, Christ and church in them but that it my Christ and church in them but that it my realm. I got that! All in all, it really was a

big accomplishment, especially with some of the poets I competed against that night like: Shenelle Gabriel who is a world renowned poet who has been on HBO Def Poetry and who is a full time poet. My friend Ebony is also a great poet and it actually came down to me and her and I won by half of a point. So I can't say enough how much of a big accomplishment it was.

Root: How can Christians such as yourself, break down barriers in the spoken word scene? The reason I ask is because it is typically other forms of poetry that is on another realm.

Thee Apprentice: Yeah I know what you mean. Even at the Logos Lounge, I censored it because you have erotic poetry and things of that nature. I can listen to an erotic poem but for the most part, I don't go to erotic poetry shows because I am a Christian and I am single so I am trying to -hold on so I am not trying to go home with that in my spirit. They do what they do so it is noth ing for them but to me that is something I would have to shake off. For Christians to try and break barriers, I would say that #1, they have to be mature. They have to be mature in their faith, mature in their belief. They have to know what they believe and can't be just a regular person that goes to church out of formality. There are many Christians that attempt to do this but make a mess out of their witness. You have some Christians that perform at slams but they curse and stuff like and they will take your poem as a good poem but it doesn't really hold any power as a Christian witness because to them they see you as one of them or somewhere in the middle. You have to let your light shine and be strong in you. When I first started going to slams, it was hard at times because there were nights when I heard some poems that I got offended by. Like when I first heard Omni's poem, "What would Jesus do", I was offended and upset. My spirit man was uptight and I was compelled to write a rebuttal. It wasn't until I spoke to him and he told me why he wrote the poem that I understood. You even have people that are demonic that do poems and slams and one time it was this kid that came and he was demonic and after he finished, the whole atmosphere was shut and it was funny and I came on right after him. I was actually glad because I said to myself this demon is up here doing a poem and I went up and because of him I did a church poem and the audience did not even know what was going on but I changed the atmosphere because the spirit that he left in the atmosphere was so demonic and he literally left the audience in a trance so even in the realm of poetry you really have to be mature in your faith and your belief and you really have to know what your standing for. I would say that if it is poetry slams, you have to have an agenda because if you don't, a slam would hurt your feelings. A score will hurt your feelings, a response will hurt your feelings and I have had my feelings hurt but God always had to remind me what my agenda was. My brother once told me that you might lose a slam but you won a soul so that has always been my motivation. Winning is winning but I am winning in a

different way.

Thee Apprentice: In the beginning of this year my bishop, Bishop Hezekiah Walker said that we spend too much time doing ministry and not enough witnessing. As Christians, we put a lot of events together that people who already go to church attend but for the most part we have not found a way to get people who don't go to church or don't believe in GOD to come to those events. So when I found slams, I found that slams was an avenue I could use to get people who are not necessarily Christian believers to come to the event. We want GOD to do the work in one shot. We want to invite somebody to church and we want them to get saved that Sunday but sometimes it's a process. So my thinking is with poetry, if they could come and the seed gets planted, that's good because then you may have someone who may say "I think I will come on a Sunday" or "When do you guys have service." One of the

One of the poets who just performed told me that he is coming to church next Sunday after contemplating for awhile about coming. The funny thing is what pushed that more is the decision I made...

Root: Can you elaborate on the decision that you are referring to?

Thee Apprentice: The decision I made... because I won the slot of the Nyorican 2009 Slam team and on the slam scene, that's the highest slot you can attain. The Nyorican is the most renowned poetry event and the most well known. Just for people to hear that you're on the team is automatic respect and the status of it is crazy! I actually didn't know the status of it until I actually won and I didn't have to prove myself to people anymore; all I had to say was I was on this team and that was enough to people who had never met me. The discrepancy that I had was actually a conflict in schedule. The team practice on Sundays from 1 to 4. For me, not just as a poet but as a minister, not to be in church on Sundays is a problem. I am a Christian and I walk by faith and not by sight; faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the word of GOD so I have to hear the word so the walk that I walk can be strengthened and encouraged and I know what direction I am going in. For me not to be in church for two months, that's gonna alter my walk of faith whether some may believe it or not. For me not to get my spiritual meal on Sundays, the schedule just was not gonna work for me so I had to make that decision in giving up my slot. It was a sad decision, however it was something that GOD told me to do and I said yes. I spoke to my Bishop about it and he told me a story about when he first started singing gospel music he had to take a stand and sometimes you have to take a stand for GOD that people outside of GOD might not understand but you have to know that its for GOD and if you take that stand GOD will

bless you for it. GOD confirmed it by taking me to the story of Abraham where Abraham so desperately wanted a child and GOD blessed him with Isaac after he and his wife were past child bearing age. Then once they had the child GOD ask him to sacrifice his child to test his faith and after Abraham was willing to sacrifice his child, there was a ram in the bush. I was looking for the ram in the bush but the ram didn't show up (laughter) but nevertheless I still hand it over to GOD and I know that he has something bigger in store and they say a sacrifice is not a sacrifice if it's not important to you and making the team was important and a big accomplishment but I'm a preacher before I'm a poet so I did not fight

it at all.

Technique


Sift together all dry ingredients, Add liquid in and electric mixing bowl and beat on medium speed until well incorportated.

How many of us remember early Sunday mornings preparing for church and hearing the radio choir singing "This is the sound of Pentecost, all over the world." Then that distinct voice would belt out, "ohh, ohh, ohh, ohh, ohh." It was none other than the Late Rev. Timothy Wright.

I have fond memories of after service Super bowl parties, late night rehearsals for recordings and fried chicken from the kitchen of Grace Tabernacle Christian Center Church of God in Christ. All of these elements were the quintessence of Elder Wright.

I was numbed by the news of what was more than a horrific accident on July 4, 2008. How could this happen? Why did this happen? A drunken driver was the vehicle that took Co-Pastor Betty Wright and DJ home to be with the Lord? And nine months longer than the doctors projected Elder Timothy Wright remained here with us as a beacon of hope and God's power. Rev. Wright finally joined his wife and grandson on April 24, 2009.

Because of Elder Timothy Wright and the Concert Choir so many others can say, "I've Got A Song To Sing", "Certainly Lord" we can "Testify" "What A Time" we had listening to these songs but, we "Cant' Stop" there; "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus" it was a "Miracle" that "One More Day" continued to be his anthem.

"Yes I'm a Believer" that "Trouble Don't Last Always". Elder Wright we "Know Your Place In God". You asked the question "Master Can You Use Me?" and with a great "Reunion" Elder Timothy Wright, "You Shall Wear A Crown".

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
